Jungle PhD's career as a rave DJ began in 1991 when he and his brother (The Stinger) were titled the "Techno Twins". They made numerous appearances at Exodus and were officially cast when Malik X resigned. Originally his title was just "PhD", however after the introduction of Jungle techno, he changed his name accordingly. Jungle PhD was a regular at the original Sykosis events, appearing alongside Dr. No and Ruffneck. They are the original crew that can be held responsible for the growth of Jungle in Toronto.

Jungle PhD was also a partner in "B's Wax Records" which specialized in underground dance music. Shortly after the store closed Jungle PhD moved to Hamilton, Ontario. He lived there for approximately one year, and now has returned to Toronto. He recently performed with Ruffneck at Delirium Friday's approximately two weeks ago. Jungle PhD's official rave comeback is scheduled for Delirium's event on January 20th 1996. Until such time he will be refuelling his record collection. PhD will also be appearing under the Murder One Sound record label that is currently owned by Ruffneck and The Silencer. So is you're wondering where in the world Ruffneck is, he's been in the studio producing.

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

For this one, the Communic8r endured many long hours amongst musty law books, including the Criminal Code of Canada. Why regurgitate generic drug information that you've learned in school or from personal experience. The Communic8 brings you the possible consequences of being caught with narcotics.

Search and Seizure:

A peace officer can search any place except for a home ("dwelling-house") as long as it is impractical for the officer to obtain a warrant and when the officer believes there is reasonable grounds that narcotics are present. A warrant must be obtained if it is a place of residence. Basically an officer can search things like airplanes, cars, and vessels which can move away quickly thus avoiding a search. A person can be searched if they are found within the boundaries of an area that has been entered for search. An officer does not have the right to stop and search a person in a public place, unless they have "good reason" to believe that the person is in possession of narcotics. Good reason could be an informant, a request by a superior officer or the suspects prior record.



Getting Caught With Narcotics (recreational use):

Recreational use means that you have the drug for your own personal consumption. Individuals with recreational amounts are usually caught by uniformed police officers by accident. Officers can identify personal amounts if they are accompanied by drug paraphernalia like papers, pipes and needles. If you plead guilty and forgo a trial the maximum punishment is up to six months in Jail and a \$1000 fine on your first offence. If you decide to fight it and are convicted anyway you could get up to seven


years. Penalties are more severe with increased offenses.



Getting Caught With Narcotics (for trafficking):


Trafficking means that you have enough amounts on your person to sell or you were caught in the act of selling. Signs that officers look for include individually wrapped drugs, large amounts of money, a scale, and/or several plastic bags. You can get up to life in prison for this offence. Penalties vary depending on the amount, the judge and/or the particular drug. Someone caught selling small amounts of marijuana will get a much lesser punishment, perhaps even just a fine. However someone who is caught trying to sell several kilos of crack or heroine is more eligible to be punished to the full extent of the law.

Hint: Saying you were just holding it for a friend is not an excuse. The Criminal Code does not deem this to be valid. Nor can an individual without narcotics pretend to sell drugs for the purpose of financial gain. Someone caught doing so is also penalized as if caught trafficking.



Not a good idea. Importing and exporting means you are caught with drugs while crossing any national border in either direction. It does not matter how much you are caught with. Also it does not matter whether or not it is for trafficking or just personal. This only matters if additional charges are brought up against you. You can theoretically be charged with importing and trafficking and end up getting two sentences. There is a minimum of seven years and a maximum of life in prison. It's an even worse idea to be caught in a foreign country. Their charges are often stricter, with the jail conditions harsher. Some countries, like Singapore, will sometimes use the death penalty.

Getting Caught Cultivating:





The preceding penalties are for individuals over the age of 18. These sentences do not apply to young offenders, however they are used as guidelines. Sentencing for young offenders is up to the judge. There are no set penalties for young offenders. Keep in mind, this does not mean that young offenders always get an easy sentence. Young offenders can be tried in adult court if a successful application has been submitted. Judges can also include in the sentence appropriate counselling for repeat offenders.



INNERVIEW A COMMUNICER EXCLUSIVE DOC MARTIN

WEARS PUMAS

Yes he wears Pumas. In fact his stage name has nothing to do with the shoe at all. His last name is actually Martin, and was given the name Doc because of the resemblance he bears to the seventh Dwarf.

Doc Martin was not what we had expected at all. Perhaps we expected an ego maniac, perhaps a sullen, reclusive guy but what we found was a jovial and open person who

was more into the music than how much of a star he was. His modesty can be explained by "When I started out in San Francisco there was no money and no glory. House was an East Coast thing. People on the West Coast were happy with what they had. It has only been in the last few years that House has become popular..."

It was the rise of house on the West coast that propelled him onto the international stage. His international career began four years ago with gigs from Honolulu to London. When asked what cities he liked best he replied: "London is good because they are so fanatical towards the music. I also enjoyed Brazil because of the strong sexual energy. Once, at a gig in Brazil, there was a foursome right in front of the D.J. booth. It was incredible. Vancouver is also

cool because of the setting - it has a very mystical vibe."

When asked what he thought of Toronto he explained that until Open House/Buzz event he didn't have a fair chance to really get into the groove because he was often stuck

between four breakbeat sets: "But at Buzz, I had a great time. There was a good combination of the Rave, House and Gay scenes which are all important to a good party."

The issue of unity was one that he stressed. "I would like to see more people become more open-minded, come out of their shell. The music is the most important part of the

whole scene. Too many people are concerned with who is at the top, we have to realize that the music is at the top and there should be the same respect for all, whether you are a promoter, a D.J. or just someone who likes to party."

And it is important to him to see how people are enjoying his sets. He likes to be right in front of the crowd so he can observe the mood. "It's all about the vibe of the crowd. If the vibe doesn't feel right I'll change my set."

The best "vibe" he ever experienced was at The Garage in San Francisco where Larry Levant was spinning. Watching Levant spin was one of the pivotal reasons Martin became a D.J. "Levant takes the best elements a song and repeats them and then all of a sudden drops the hammer." Some of his other influences are

Frankie Knuckles, Tony Humphreys and Carl Cox: "Tony keeps that bass going kinda've like old motown grooves, and Carl Cox is

amazing on three decks, he doesn't even need to use earphones."

He formulated his career by listening to the greats, who he has since played with. He offers advice to new D.J.'s: "Always do what you feel is right. Never get involved with the politics of the promoters. Don't worry about the size of the party, all that matters is how people react to your music. Never get into the industry for money, glory or women,



you'll never last. Keep a good attitude and always be thankful to the crowd."

His way of saying thanks is by keeping the music going on the tables and in the studio. For about a year and a half now he has been producing music. He currently has a five single deal with Eastern Bloc records, he has released a single called Groovalicious on the Strictly Rhythm label and he is doing a remix of D.J. Pierre's Single Dubb Tribe. When asked which he prefers, mixing or producing he explained "I like producing music because I am completely in control and making music I like to hear, but I also like mixing because of the instant reaction from the crowd and because of the rush. I don't really like doing one over the other, I like doing both for different reasons."

We were pretty fortunate to have met up with Doc considering he gave this interview at five in the morning after finishing his set at Buzz. If you want to catch up to him, you can see him at Roxy's in New York every Friday night from Nov 1st on - or at the December 2nd Syrous event.


