
N: Elementary my dear Watson. One.

RAVE ORGANIZATION OBITUARIES





FROM COMMUNICAR ARCHIVES



The Communic8r's never ending quest to document Toronto's rave history continues, this time paying respect to six of Toronto's extinct organizations. By bringing forth those who helped in shaping our scene, we gain better understanding of our culture.

EXODUS PRODUCTIONS U.K. (1991-1994)



"No carnival bullshit. Just hardcore uproar, you know the score."

Remembered for: Pioneering the rave scene and combining both rave and warehouse music in the same venue.

As previously stressed this was Toronto's first rave organization. They began mid 1991 and had their last event, "The Unity Ball" at The Opera House on April 2, 1994. During their existence they held approximately 15 events ranging in size from 500-1500. Members include John, Anthony, and Mark. There are currently no plans for another event. Members explain, "Exodus had its days, the memory will live strong."

CHEMISTRY PRODUCTIONS U.K. (1991-1994)

ヒHミロナごエヒト

"Dedicated to: the progression of understanding, having a fu*king good time and peace in the cosmos"

Remembered for: Creating larger U.K. vibe oriented events and Toronto's first outdoor event.

This was the second of Toronto's rave organizations. It began in winter 1991 with a Friday event that gathered 200 people to a freezing warehouse on River St. Chemistry's last event, "The Final Farewell" was at 318 Richmond St. W. Dec. 11, 1994. Between these dates they had about 10 large events, one of which included the 1993 New Year's party. Members include: DJ Alx of London, Nav, and Charlotte. Rumour has it that Alx was recently planning a comeback. I guess we'll just have to wait and see.

NITROUS (1992-1993)



"This is your brain, this is your brain on Nitrous"

Remembered for: Introducing different types of people and music into Toronto's rave culture.

This organization began in 1992 with "Nitrous 012" at an abandoned warehouse near Church and Gerard St. Nitrous, "The Grand Finale" took place on Saturday April 3, 1993. Nitrous hosted about five events that gathered 800-2000 people. There are currently no plans for a comeback. However, four of the original crew, Don, James, lain, and Claudio, have continued to promote. They are now known as "Atlantis" which is alive and kicking.

SYKOSIS PROMOTIONS (1992-1995)

SYKOSIS

"Classic rave anthems without the mainstream commercial shit."

Remembered for: The roots of Toronto's jungle scene, and the continuation of the Exodus vibe.

The majority of Sykosis' events were held at 318 Richmond St. W. Their first event took place on Sept. 5, 1992. Throughout its existence Sykosis held approximately 15 events. It is difficult to establish when the last one took place. For promoters Ben and Mike it ended at "Ravestock" because of the many difficulties that such as large event bring. A couple of small events did follow, which were Ravestock benefits. Sykosis was then passed down to Marcus and Ruffneck in early 1995. Unfortunately this event was cancelled due to unforseen circumstances. There are currently no plans for return.

PHAZE PROMOTIONS (1992-1993)

"Our ideals are bold and progressive. However, the essential ingredient is you."



Remembered for: Unique musical blend and Toronto's first Hallowe'en rave. This organization began on Hallowe'en 1992. Their existence was short and sweet with a total of only three events. However, each event gathered approximately 1000 persons which was an extremely large number for the time. Their last event "Fusion" took place on Saturday, May 8, 1993. There are currently no plans for a Phaze return. Gus, George and have all pursued other careers.

INFINITY PRODUCTIONS (1993-1995)

"When your brain wants to orgasm, you know where to come."



Remembered for: Original attractions and early jungle events with large attendances.

This organization started on Feb. 6, 1993 with an attendance exceeding 1,500. Unfortunately the event was shut down at 4 in the morning. However, the score was settled at "infinity's Revenge" where the very same venue (Commissioners) was rocked again. Their final event was on May 14, 1994. Infinity did return from the dead earlier this year, but Warren and Jim have now decided to let it Rest in Peace.




LIQUID ADRENALINE

GEORGE H., 20 CRAIG S., 21 PETE W., 21

One of Toronto's newest success stories in the rave scene is Liquid Adrenaline. At only their third party they managed to gather 1900 people. How did they come by these incredible results? George feels that it's because they're responsive to the advice of the partiers: "We try to listen to all of the suggestions...keep this, take that away...we want everyone to have a good time...and that's the bottom line." Liquid had been around for quite some time before they attempted throwing raves. They all grew up with the music, following it from breakdance, early freestyle, and then got into house, which led to techno. They observed that only one person was selling smart drinks and he was from

Detroit, and could only come to Toronto occasionally. At this time George and Craig started one of Toronto's first smart bars and have been a fixture in the scene ever since. The Liquid crew has also had many offers from corporate companies to commercialize their smart drink - but wary of scams they have resisted and have remained true to the scene. The organization's third member, Pete, Joined with Craig and George to help create the Liquid Adrenaline rave company. Their next party on Jan. 27 is called "Illumination". We have been told that the flyer will be something in the theme of the event's title. We have also been told that the decor will be insane. The Liquid crew was described to us as a "family". Freaky Flow, Mk, Venom and Easy Rush are all Important aspects of the company, "and so is everyone else who has helped us along the way." It looks as though this crew has the right attitude towards promotion, keeping their heart in it. Maybe that's their

We're sure you'll be interested in hearing his story. We certainly were. The true identity of this person will be with held for obvious reasons.

How did you get caught?

I was driving a buddy and his girl friend around. We were just cruising and had just lit up a hash joint. The next thing I knew there was an officer behind me following. I guess this may have been because we were driving my father's new Infiniti. Next thing I knew they flashed their lights and I pulled over. The hash was still fogging up the car. My buddy managed to hide the joint under his seat.

What happened next?

They took my licence and walked away to go check it out. I thought it was just a routine check. I was wrong. They came back rather quickly and asked, "Who's got the pot? This car stinks". They asked me to get out and took me to the cruiser behind. They searched me further and managed to locate the twenty e tablets I had in my inside jacket.

Oops. What about the other two In the car?

I saw them go and question my friends and found out later they both get searched. They had nothing. I was in trouble. They began to search my car fully and also found the ounce of hash in

my glove compartment. I don't know if I can say that I was lucky, but they didn't find the hash I had deep in my pocket. It was separated into grams. So on my

way to the station I ate them. Bad move. Eight grams don't sit very well.

Did you get sick?

Shortly after I went through the routine search of my body cavities I began feeling III and started throwing up in my cell. The cell wasn't like anything you see in movies. It was pretty clean. For those wondering big bubba didn't ask me to bend over for soap. Why in the hell would you go back to dealing after such a horrible experience?

One word. Money. The one day I spent in hell is well worth the large amounts of coin that I rake in.

If you do get in trouble with the law make sure you know your rights. The arresting officer is required by law to ask you if you are aware of them. These rights have been designed to ensure that you receive fair and equal treatment under the eyes of Canadian law. They are not meant to be a cliche line in movies. Knowing your rights is half the battle.



4. This retired organization promoted an event with circular flyers actually sealed inside cellophane packaging. Which organization was it?

5. It can be said that this was Toronto's first rave oriented club. Tuesday events were live to air on AM 640. What was the club's name? For some time now the scene in England has been plagued. It has been hurt by scams, con artists, fake raves, and by a new crime bill. It has gotten to the point where it is hard to find a place to party. Perhaps the worst thing that has arisen is the consistency of fake raves. People will pay up to 25 pounds on an advance ticket only to show up and find no Djs, no sound, no people, and no party. Out of this disturbing trend has come a company called D.LY.

The D.I.Y. (Do it Yourself) collective is group of partiers who have banded together to throw free parties. They try to do one every two or three months. People often said: "If you don't like it, do it yourself." So they did.

How do they support themselves? Because all of

the members are involved in the industry (there are which is what they all say regardless of music, location or people. It was quite funny. Another time, when we were completely biltzed, we got busted at eight in the morning, and then had to spend the entire day in the cell completely fried. The worst was when some of our partners had to spend four days in jail and were never really told why." said Digs.

Thank God Toronto does not have this Bill eh?

There is also officially up to a \$5000 fine for throwing a rave, which under the Bill is a gathering of more than 40 people in one place at one time listening to loud thumping music... Thankfully we've never gotten one. It is going to take the police a little while to fully learn how to use the Bill in their favour, so none of the major

penalties in the Bill have been used yet, but when they do..."



up to 20 people in the collective) they can usually keep costs down on lights, tables etc. They always try to find a free venue, like a public field, abandoned warehouse or even a secluded farmer's field. Their only real cost is gas for the generator, and they pass a hat around to scrounge enough money for that. Because of these venues they often get busted and have spent their fair share of nights in fail.

The Communic8r spent a few hours with Digs and Woosh, two Djs from the collective, while they were in Toronto, spinning at Buzz. Their music is hard, hypnotic house, as opposed to trance, breakbeats or jungle. They love to party and travel and have played in cities from San Francisco to Stutgaart.

Relaxing with them after their set we discovered how easy-going and laid back they were. It almost seems like their ultimate goal would be to throw the ultimate party.

"These days it's pretty rare that a party will last too long. The police will try and kick you out of their county or throw you in jail if you're one of the promoters." The new problems with the police can be attributed to a new, stricter crime bill that was just passed in the British Legislature. Not only is it stricter, but it also has specific references to raves and this makes it easier for the police to crack down on parties. Even with this reference in the new bill, police still don't really understand what a "rave" or a party is. "One time, when we were arrested for throwing a party, the cop put down throwing acid house party on the rap sheet

So are there any legal parties, parties that can't get busted?

"Well, there are, but the music isn't the same, the crowd isn't the same, the whole vibe is different...it is almost like making a bad copy of a good thing. But small parties are often left alone, parties of 200 to 300 people. It is more of a hassle for the police to confiscate a sound system for that small of a party. As long as they see that the party isn't going to last two or three days, which they used to do on a regular basis, they'll just lef it fizzle out on its own."

And so their search for the ultimate party continues.

What is the largest party they've played at so far? "Well, there's this festival called Castle Martin and there was loads of light, seven or eight sound systems to suit seven or eight stages, lots of campers, lots of vehicles and 25,000 people showed up. It was a great time, it lasted a couple of days..."

But they hesitate to suggest that a large party is always a better party: "You can have smaller parties where the vibe is great and it only lasts a night and it ends up being one of the better parties you go to. It all depends on what you're looking for and on the scene..."

It was fun relaxing with Digs and Woosh after their set, but one thing is for sure: let's hope Canada does not try to crack down on the scene like they are beginning to in England. Let's hope Allan Rock. Canada's justice minister, sticks to keeping duns off the streets and not parties.






